Patient Priorities Care Tele Educational Course

This virtual course outlines the Patient Priorities Care (PPC) decision-making framework for persons with multiple chronic conditions.

Why it matters: PPC is an evidence-based, feasible clinical practice associated with improved outcomes including:

- Reduced treatment burden
- Reduction in unwanted care
- Increase in desired care.

The core content of the course will be delivered over 6 sessions, with an optional seventh session geared towards those (with or without formal roles in education) who wish to teach this framework to other health professionals or trainees.

Who should take this course? Health professional leaders and educators who want to transform clinical care to focus on What Matters or carry out curricula to educate others to provide care that aligns with What Matters.

Certification: Participants who miss no more than 1 live, virtual session will receive an *“Expert in Patient Priorities Care” certificate*. Sessions will be recorded, but live attendance is required to receive certification.
